What do we do?

We ensure strict controls and design elements that prevent the mingling of your data with that of other organizations. And we ensure that our datacenter staff does not have access to your data. Additionally, if a customer experiences monthly uptime that is less than 99.9 percent, we compensate that customer through service credits.

Microsoft is the first major cloud provider to adopt [the world's first international standard for cloud privacy](#). The standard establishes a uniform, international approach to protecting privacy for personal data stored in the cloud.

It reinforces that:

- You take your data with you if you ever choose to leave the service.
- Your data won't be used for advertising.
- We encourage government inquiry to be made directly to you unless legally prohibited and will challenge attempts to prohibit disclosure in court.
